

Tom Moore

21 year old Tom Moore, of Jessop Road, Stevenage, died last week following a fall from a mountain in Lichtenstein.

Tom was an Explorer Scout Leader in Stevenage, having been a Beaver, Cub, Scout with St. Nicholas Scout Group and one of the inaugural members of the Stevenage Explorer Scout Unit meeting in Chells, Stevenage. Tom was also a driving force in the setting up of the newly formed Scout Network in Stevenage.

Tom also helped a number of times at the 6th Southgate Beaver Scout Colony, including an evening on recycling and a green lifestyle.

Tom had been awarded his Queen's Scout Award at the St George's Day Parade at Windsor Castle in 2007 and his Gold D of E award. He had also gained his Explorer Belt, following a two week expedition in Uganda in 2006, including a trip up Kilimanjaro.

Tom had completed a Mountain Leader Training Course at Plas y Brennan, Snowdonia, and an Advanced Mountaineering Course with Hertfordshire Scouts at their activity centre at Lochearnhead, Stirling, Scotland. He had completed Hertfordshire Scouts' 40 mile walk in the Chilterns, running most of it, in 2006.

Tom has also competed in Hertfordshire Peak Assault, both as an Explorer Scout and as a Leader.

This year he completed the Derbyshire Three Peaks Challenge, wearing a bikini top.

Tom's Funeral will be held on Thursday 28th August 1.30pm at the Church of St Andrew and St George in Cuttys Lane and afterwards at the District HQ in Magpie Crescent. At the families request they would like a strong scouting attendance. There will be a light buffet and a pay bar.
